Block of the Month



Last month, I was a little late posting the block instructions due to an exciting visit from my sister who travelled all the way from Dryden to watch the eclipse. Thank you for all of the reminders and for your patience!

In April, we were introduced to the final star block in the *Stars of the City* pattern! I hope all of you enjoyed working on the Double Ribbon Star block, as well as getting the chance to look back on all the others we've made to select your favourite block for the quilt centre. I can't wait to see which one each of you chose!

If you're still deciding which of those blocks you'd like to feature, remember that instructions for all of the blocks in this pattern will remain on the Block of the Month page of the guild website, so you can take your time selecting your favourite!

For everyone who is ready to move forward with their quilt, May brings the final step in this block of the month project; quilt top assembly!

Assembling the quilt top from here is as simple as piecing your Drunkard's Path and Pseudo Drunkard units into border blocks, sewing those border blocks to the star blocks, and joining everything together with sashing! However, there is an extra step for anyone making the Queen sized quilt; you'll need to make just a few more blocks before you'll be ready to assemble the full quilt top. But a few extra blocks means that much more time to enjoy the project!

Full instructions for finishing your *Stars of the City* quilt will be posted to the website following the in person meeting on 02 May 2024. I can't wait to see how your quilts turn out!

Reminder: The Library Thing is fully updated, and can be accessed on the Guild website, from the Library tab.




