What started as a project with a deadline saw a need greater than its boundaries. This project, which provides comfort quilts for survivors of the residential schools across Canada, has gained worldwide attention, which the Executive Committee wholeheartedly supports. You can also enjoy a visit to the spa to ease the aching shoulders after a quilting session.


Everyone must be double vaxed to attend. This might be the last Guild Retreat.
