



Thoughts

Need a challenge for February? Kelley Richardson has challenged herself to create 28 different quilt designs in 28 days using 1 layer cake and 1.5m of coordinating fabric. She'll be posting a video with he quilt design and pattern on her YouTube channel here

Need to wash a long piece of fabric? The Quilt Rat has a suggestion her blog <u>here</u> that should help with dealing with the snarls of fabric that usually arise. She serged the ends and then folded and basted the edges before washing.

I finished my Poinsettia block from the Kathy K Wylie workshop recently. When I rinsed the block to remove the washout marker, some of the reds ran. This <u>article</u> was helpful in removing the reds from the background of my block. Since it was just a block, I used a small bucket and let it soak for a couple of hours.

things I like:

- connecting to friends (because online/telephone contact is better than none)
- connecting to new people around the world that I never thought I would be able to meet.
- Working at home not packing up my machine and supplies and resetting up at the workshop location.
 And no commuting.
- The flexibility to being able to mute conversation, have video or not. If I am running late, I can eat my
 breakfast while listening to the meeting and not disturb the other participants (by muting and not having
 video on), then turn it on when ready.

things that I don't like:

 I lose the energy of the people around me. You just don't get that same energy exchange/boost over zoom/social media.

- I don't see how the other participants in the workshop are creating their pieces and how they are working through the process (this could be a positive too). I lose the intuitive feel of the room.
- It can be harder to grasp certain concepts or techniques as the instructor cannot see if you are struggling and come and ask/assist you. Some instructors are better at this than others.
- It's difficult to have a private conversation on zoom with a group. There is no chatting to the person sitting beside you.
- There are security issues with zoom or other less secure platforms. It's important to understand what your background, image and sounds from your home could tell others about you/your location (and whomever may be lurking/hacking into the feed).
