Community Outreach (Core)

For the benefit of our new members, we thought we would explain what the CORE Group does. We would like to emphasize that the group is open to all members and we appreciate the donations and help from those who participate.

Part of the Mississauga Quilt Guild Constitution states that the Guild is to contribute to the community by way of charitable donations. The City provides us with meeting space at a special rate because of the contributions we make to a variety of local charities.

Due to the pandemic, some of our previous charities are now not taking donations. Currently, we make deliveries of quilts to the Salvation Army, Hospice of Peel, Children's Aid Society, Peel Family Shelter and Breakfast with Santa Layette Program. We provide placemats to Meals on Wheels, and knitted Izzy dolls to accompany the children's quilts. Last year, the Salvation Army asked us for teen pillowcases which they distribute at Christmas to teens in shelters.

The CORE group meets on the Wednesday following the Guild meeting, at the Tomken Arena from 10AM to 1:30PM. During this time, batting for quilts is cut and fabric from donations is available to pick up. Patterns and backing fabric can also be obtained. Placemat kits have been assembled for an easy make-and-take project, or bring your machine and work on one while you catch up with your fellow Guild members. It's also a great opportunity to pin your quilts while the big tables are set up. Pins only please. Basting spray is not allowed. Bring your lunch and be prepared for some social chat while you get some quilt preparation done.

During our in-person meetings, we have a table with quilts that have been made for us, and you can help us build up our supply for the fall deliveries. Our challenge for the fall is for each member to bring us at least 1 placemat either at the October or November meeting. One side of the placemat is usually winter/seasonal and the other side more of a spring design. Please keep in mind while picking fabric, that there are also men who receive them. We would love to collect 300 placemats for this year.

Night for CORE - Virtual

October 6, 2022 – Sharon Fisher, Gardening Mum Quilts - Physical Focus on wool applique and stitch

Sharon combines her love of texture and colour with traditional, primitive and whimsical themes. She uses embellishments to enrich basic designs, therefore creating a niche for herself as a teacher sharing her skills and passions with others. Sharon considers herself a life-long learner, enhancing her skills and knowledge through various forms.

November 3, 2022 –Breanna Gaudaur, Rose & Ivy Quilts - Physical A Modern Trunk Show

Enjoy a fresh look at quilting through the eyes of a passionate 26-year-old. Be inspired by a multitude of exciting new patterns and colour ideas.

January 5, 2023 – Joanna Dermenjian - Virtual Canada's Forgotten Wartime Quilts

Did you know that Canadian quilters made over 400,000 quilts in World War 2 for families in Europe? The story of the quilters and these quilts are at risk of being lost to history. However, Joanna Dermenjian of Suture and Selvedge is an independent researcher who is working towards rediscovering the truth behind the Canadian women. Joanna will be talking about her research and the important contribution these women had to world history.

February 3, 2023 – Beth Helfter, EvaPaige Quilt Designs - Virtual Oompah Accordian Sewn HSTs

Beth's penchant for scraps and her need to use as many fabrics as possible in her quilts led her to develop the Accordion Sewn HSTs™ method of creating half square triangles that don't have a match and yet waste no fabric. Delving into the method further, she discovered "ordering" the accordions could lead to the creation of whole blocks and quilts from a single accordion.

April 6, 2023 – Rose Parr - Physical Healthy Quilting

Rose Parr can relate and wants to be a pain-free quilter for as long as she possibly can. Her studies of wellness and ergonomics are integrated into her daily studio practice, and she shows us how to do it, too. What inspires you to create?

May 4, 2023 – Millie Cumming, Fibre Artist - Physical Making your own quilts more personal

Millie made her first attempt at textile art during late nights looking after her newborn son. Beginning with an applique course, Millie has gone on to acclaim in the world of Art Quilts. Her textiles are not of traditional patterns, but creative interpretations of subjects close to her heart. Delicacy and a demanding perfection mark her work, tinged with a sweet nostalgia for nature, memories and cottage life.

This quilt was designed following advice sent in by members over the past summer; mixing elements of traditional and modern quilt styles, use of simple and beginner friendly blocks, a scrap friendly design, and can be made in a variety of sizes.

For a first look at this year's BoM project, tune in to our first virtual guild meeting of the year on 08 September! Fabric requirements for the quilt will be posted to the website following that meeting.

Saturday November 5th: Robyn Baumgart - **Crayon Appliqué** www.quiltingintheloft.com

This class explores how to work with a time honoured & classic child's art tool---- Crayons applied to fabric!

In this class you will learn how to apply (appliqué) crayons to solid white cotton & a canning jar vase of flowers. (Design will be provided prior to the class). You will also learn how to set the crayons properly so that the colour is permanent & the colour will not wash out. Outlining of the whole design can be done with permanent black markers &/or free motion quilting. Robin will demonstrate all techniques so all skill levels can attend this class. These new techniques can be applied to all of your future projects & will allow you to customize almost anything for one of a kind results. So much fun!

In this three-hour workshop, you will learn the basics of Accordion Sewn HSTs™, the innovative and incredibly fun method of making HSTs invented by Beth Helfter of EvaPaige Quilt Designs. We will practice with fabric scraps, then create a quilt block.

From Beth: Why take the Intro to Accordion Sewn HSTs™ Workshop?

The Accordion Sewn HSTs™ method came to me almost in a fever dream, and since then I've been on a mission to bring it to groups everywhere, showing the cool things it can do, from scrappy to ordered accordions that create a block practically in one fell swoop. In this class, you will learn the basic technique, and apply it to an ordered accordion block. We will take it one step further and learn Accordion Sewn QSTs™ too! So much fun!

sponsored Adelaide Luckhart Dutfield in the 5 - 9 year old group. Her piece is called Funest Time Ever.



I was honoured to win second place in the traditional quilt category at the National Juried Show for my quilt, *Canada: Our Favourite Things* (right). This quilt has also been selected for the 'Best of Canadian Quilts' exhibit at 'The New England Quilt Museum' in Lowell, Massachusetts.

The original design was inspired after I took a math workshop with the MQG – examples from the Farmer's Wife Sampler quilt inspired me to make a quilt with Canadian blocks – can you identify all 47 images?

I was very surprised when my Trendtex Challenge Quilt, 2020-21 You Need to Refresh Your Screen, was awarded second place.
