Message from the President: Welcome to Spring

As we all know the guild has been operating with a deficit for a few years. Our last membership fee increase was in 2007. There were many reasons for this deficit. First, the loss of income from members that did not renew their membership because of COVID. Second, the increase costs for rent, program presenters, workshops and Insurance, both Accident and Liability. We are saving rent money with our Zoom meetings in the winter, but we have to pay for the Zoom subscription.

At the last executive meeting, we passed a motion to increase the membership fee to \$55.00 for existing members and to \$65.00 for new members for the coming year. The name tags now cost \$15.00 each. The membership has to vote on this issue, and at the general meeting I will request a motion for the increase of the membership fees. Please bring any questions you have; the executive will be there to answer them.

We are looking ahead to September, and we have executive positions available. We need a Vice-President, Treasurer and Social Committee members. We also need coordinators for Program, Workshop, Membership and Website. Please step up and volunteer, these positions do not require a lot of time and they do make life interesting.

Please remember your quilts for show and share. I am looking forward to seeing you at Huron Park Recreation Centre.

Program

April 6, 2023 – Paul Taylor - Physical The Educated Sewer and Tales of a Tech

Paul Taylor, Sew Tec Sewing Machine Repair, kindly agreed to present in April when our original speaker was no longer available. Paul's presentation will demonstrate the basics of how a sewing machine stitches. He will then look at various components of sewing machines: thread tension, spool types and spool orientation (I only recently found out about this – and it's made a difference. SV), bobbin winding and bobbin selection, and presser feet. Paul writes, "My purpose in creating this part of the presentation was to help people get the most from their machines by giving them the confidence to explore and experiment."

In Tales of a Tech, Paul will share his Rogues' Gallery photos. He'll share examples of some of the dirtier machines that he's serviced. They weren't as bad as they looked, while some of the less dramatic examples can in fact pose real problems. It's important that we know what machine owners can do to take better care of our machines and how a technician can do when we need help. http://www.sewtec.ca/

Saturday, April 15, 2023: Robyn Baumgart - Crayon Appliqué www.auiltinaintheloft.com

This class explores how to work with a time honoured & classic child's art tool----Crayons applied to fabric!

In this class you will learn how to apply (appliqué) crayons to solid white cotton & a canning jar vase of flowers. (Design will be provided prior to the class). You will also learn how to set the crayons properly so that the colour is permanent & the colour will not wash out. Outlining of the whole design can be done with permanent black markers &/or free motion quilting. Robin will demonstrate all techniques so all skill levels can attend this class. These new techniques can be applied to all of your future projects & will allow you to customize almost anything for one of a kind results. So much fun!

Block of the Month

I hope all of you have been enjoying the March block, Jack's Delight, and are excited for the next one!

April's block will be the last one for this year's project and is a very simple pattern; Rail Fence! This is one of my all-time favourite blocks and was used in my first ever quilt! The instructions include two different methods; strip piecing for those of you using yardage and scrap piecing for those of you working from remnants. Be sure to follow the instructions that best fit your materials!

The next meeting will be back to in person, so I will be unable to attend. My sample blocks have been sent ahead, including samples from the Winter blocks if you're interested in seeing those. Visit Darlene Jenah to check them out! And remember, the next meeting is at Huron Park, not our usual meeting place, so be sure to check your directions before 06 April!
