Our in-person meetings now include the **Too Good To Throw Away** table.


Bring in anything guilt related that you no longer need:


Take anything you like from the table. No charge! Even if you have nothing to leave on the table, you can still take anything you like.

Block of the Month







With another month quickly coming to an end, I hope you've all had a chance to put together one or both of the February star blocks! Personally, I'm particularly fond of the Queen of the Sky block and had a lot of fun piecing it together! If you haven't yet completed your February blocks, there's no rush to get them done as the instructions will remain available on the guild website to access at any time: https://www.mississaugaquiltersguild.ca/block-of-the-month.html

Moving into March, we will be piecing together the last set of Drunkard's Path and Pseudo Drunkard units, called unit C! I'll admit that I'm a little behind on my Drunkard's Path units, I haven't finished the batch from January yet, but I find they come together quickly once you get the hang of them!

Some members have shared that they're struggling their way through the curve piecing method from the instructions, and have sought other methods for piecing their curves. What a great idea!

I found a post on Quilting Daily by Sarah Erickson outlining several different methods for curved piecing by machine which may help if you haven't quite gotten the hang of the method from the block instructions: https://www.quiltingdaily.com/curved-piecing-quilt-tutorial-a-curvy-roundup/

Or, if you enjoy hand sewing, you could also try piecing your Drunkard's Path units by hand using traditional hand piecing, English paper piecing, or by appliqueing template A (the circle) onto template B (the crescent).

And if none of those methods are quite what you're looking for, you can always try putting together the Pseduo Drunkard unit, which uses only straight line piecing!

Block instructions for Drunkard's Path and Pseudo Drunkard unit C will be posted to the website following our next virtual meeting on 07 March 2024, I hope to see you there!


