The new block for this month is called Double Ribbon Star, which uses many of the same techniques and units introduced previously; however, this month also has a twist! In addition to the Double Ribbon Star block, you will select your favourite star block from past months and make another one--or two depending on your finished quilt size--to feature as the central block of your quilt. I look forward to seeing which block each of you chooses!

I'm not sure yet whether I will be able to make it to that meeting, so if you see me, please say hello, or if I'm not there, Marie will be showing samples of the Double Ribbon Star block in my place! 


# **News from the Library Convenors**

the Library tab. The books can be sorted by Title, Author, or tags.
