We continue to organize and clean out our cabinets. The Workshop team has done a wonderful job with our new storage area. Fat quarters and quilt blocks are being cut for future sale tables

In order to use our batting in the best way, we usually use pieced sections for our placemats. Some members have provided us with donations in the past. If you have any batting pieces you don't need, we would love to use them for our placemat kits. Please bring to the December meeting if possible.

Deliveries are right on schedule to Children's Aid and Meals on Wheels. We provided Armagh House with 9 adult and 14 child's quilts.

DECEMBER MEETING--Come prepared for a fun craft and a special show and share. We are asking everyone to bring in a favorite Christmas project they have made. It can be a quilt, placemat, runner...whatever you would like to show. Please bring your own beverage, we will have some festive cookies as a treat. CORE is hosting this meeting as a thank you to everyone who supports our community donations.

This month, we are highlighting Meal on Wheels, who accept our placemat deliveries each December. This organization is run by the Victorian Order of Nurses and provides affordable and nutritious meals 5 days per week. Volunteers prepare the meals in government inspected kitchens, dietary needs and restrictions are taken into account. Recipients are older adults, adults with disabilities and those recovering from illness or surgery. Placemats have a seasonal side to them and are a bright addition to the homes.

Block of the Month

With November coming to an end, I hope you were all able to find the time to piece a few Drunkard's Path or Pseudo Drunkard units!

Throughout the month, I received a few questions regarding the templates for these units -- I'm sure many of you noticed how flimsy the paper templates can be -- and wanted to share more information about my particular process with you all! I wish I had thought to share this at the beginning of the month, but we will be using these templates twice more for Drunkard's units B and C, so I hope the information there will help you in the future!



Moving on from those units, the upcoming month of December will bring two new star blocks; Birds of the Night and Farmer's Star! These blocks use some of the same techniques from the October star blocks, but also introduce a new unit, the half rectangle triangle! These are made in a similar way to half square triangles, but the orientation of the seam matters a lot, be sure to double check the diagrams in the pattern as you go!

I won't be at the meeting on 07 December to share my blocks, but Marie Starr has prepared some samples on my behalf. Thanks Marie!

As usual, if you have any questions, comments, or concerns while working on your blocks, please don't hesitate to reach out! Or if you'd like a virtual demo of any part of this year's BoM pattern, I am available to meet during the Sew and Chat sessions, just let me know which one you plan to attend and I'll meet you there!

Sew and Chat


There are 4 opportunities per week to join these informal "gettogethers" from your home. Please remember that you can join in using your phone or tablet, you're not limited to just your computer.
