Thank you for all the wonderful donations brought to us in September. We delivered quilts and teen pillowcases to the Salvation Army and are now preparing other drop offs. Please bring completed items to the October meeting, as we do not have a November meeting to collect donations.

The block challenge brought in over 60 blocks, we will begin assembling quilt tops at the next workshop. The date for that workshop is TUESDAY OCTOBER 17TH, at 10:00 am. We are happy to be back at Tomken arena for this workshop.

Back by popular demand--a CORE sale table will be at the October meeting. We will have \$1 and \$5 items, please drop by to check them out.

Friendly reminder, if you take pillowcase kits from the CORE table, they need to be returned to the CORE group. The fabrics for these pillowcases are donated to CORE or are purchased by us from our funds. Please return the completed pillowcases to us for distribution.

We had some inquiries regarding the charities we donate to. We have decided to highlight one charity each month in the newsletter, so you can learn about our community partners. This month, we are donating quilts to a silent auction at the DAM, so we will feature them this time

The DAM, which stands for Develop, Assist and Mentor, was started in Meadowvale in 1995, and also has a building in Cooksville. They provide drop in times for youth in both areas. It is a safe, inclusive space for youth age 13-19. There are after school and lunch drop in times, as well as other programs relating to school, co-op placements and job opportunities.

Mississauga Quilters Guild **Block of the Month**



I hope you've all had enough time to select your colours and pick out some beautiful fabric for your Stars of the City guilts! I've chosen a new colour scheme myself, which I'm really excited to be working with!

Now, with October on the horizon, it will soon be time to start piecing our blocks!

October will bring the first two star blocks; Harbour at Dawn (left) and Square in a Star (right). These blocks feature the stitch and flip method, two at a time half square triangles, and four at a time quarter square triangles. Many of these techniques should be familiar from past BoM guilts, but all are great for beginners who may be joining the BoM quilt along for the first time!

Instructions for these blocks will be posted on the Block of the Month page following our next guild meeting on 05 October 2023.
