Program

February 2, 2023 – Beth Helfter, EvaPaige Quilt Designs - Virtual Oompah Accordion Sewn HSTs

Beth’s penchant for scraps and her need to use as many fabrics as possible in her quilts led her to develop the Accordion Sewn HSTs™ method of creating half square triangles that don't have a match and yet waste no fabric. Delving into the method further, she discovered "ordering" the accordions could lead to the creation of whole blocks and quilts from a single accordion.



March 3, 2023 – Corey Ralph, Sew Manly Quilting - Virtual

Corey (B.Bus, E.Ed, MBA, RMT) found quilting in the fall of 2014 when he needed an outlet for his creative side. He was inspired after seeing his mother completed/built a pinwheel quilt with love and passion some years earlier.



April 6, 2023 – Rose Parr - Physical Healthy Quilting

Rose Parr can relate and wants to be a pain-free quilter for as long as she possibly can. Her studies of wellness and ergonomics are integrated into her daily studio practice, and she shows us how to do it, too. What inspires you to create?

May 4, 2023 – Millie Cumming, Fibre Artist - Physical Making your own quilts more personal

Millie made her first attempt at textile art during late nights looking after her newborn son. Beginning with an applique course, Millie has gone on to acclaim in the world of Art Quilts. Her textiles are not of traditional patterns, but creative interpretations of subjects close to her heart. Delicacy and a demanding perfection mark her work, tinged with a sweet nostalgia for nature, memories and cottage life.

Saturday February 4, 2023, Beth Helfter - **Intro to Accordion Sewn HST'S (half square triangles)**

In this this 3-hour workshop, you will learn a new, and incredibly fun method of doing scrappy half square triangles. We will practice with fabric, and then complete a 14" block pictured at left.

Ruthie's very excited about this class. It's a technique she's never heard of in her many years of quilting.

Saturday March 4th, 2023 Christina de Miranda - **Fundamentals of Foundation Paper Piecing - Lara's Hymn.**

"Cristina De Miranda has been crafting and creating since her early years watching Art Attack. A tactile world of colour, pattern, and design appeared before her when a colleague introduced her to quilting in 2018. Cristina quickly dusted off her sewing machine and dived into a plethora of designer fabrics. Today, she is totally and irreversibly immersed in a whimsical world called Ships & Violins.



The name Ships & Violins was inspired by a Pablo Neruda poem called "How much happens in a day" which celebrates the transient nature of life. Both ships and violins require exceptional craftsmanship to be successful in their purpose - a reminder to bring the same care and attention to her own craft every day.

Saturday, April 15, 2023: Robyn Baumgart - **Crayon Appliqué**

This class explores how to work with a time honoured & classic child's art tool---- Crayons applied to fabric!

In this class you will learn how to apply (appliqué) crayons to solid white cotton & a canning jar vase of flowers. (Design will be provided prior to the class). You will also learn how to set the crayons properly so that the colour is permanent & the colour will not wash out. Outlining of the whole design can be done with permanent black markers &/or free motion quilting. Robin will demonstrate all techniques so all skill levels can attend this class. These new techniques can be applied to all of your future projects & will allow you to customize almost anything for one of a kind results. So much fun!

Block of the Month

With the most challenging block, Dove at the Window, completed last month, we are moving into a much simpler block for February. In my opinion, it's the simplest block we'll be making for Summer Garden!

The February block is Snowball! This block uses larger pieces than many of the others we've made so far and introduces the stitch and flip method! It's very quick to put together so if you fell a little behind on your January blocks, you'll have some extra time in February to get caught up! I'll need that extra time myself since my January blocks aren't all completely finished just yet.



