Quilts of Valour

During the month of November our thoughts may be focused on Remembrance Day and the people who have defended our country over the years. For many years Quilts of Valour - Canada has recognized the service of many of these soldiers and veterans through the presentation of quilts. A symbol of comfort and caring, these quilts are made by quilters across Canada and presented with the support of the Canadian Armed Forces. Led by our local representative (and Guild member), Virginia Rothwell, we have been a part of the national effort to provide these quilts.

If you are aware of a veteran who should receive a quilt, please visit the website (www.quiltsofvalour.ca) and look for the box on the right of the screen - Request a quilt.

Our group of Quilts of Valour includes members of this guild but others from Peel, Halton, Toronto and beyond offer their talents and skills. Longarm quilters donate their services to complete some of the larger quilts.

During the pandemic was an interesting time for us. Unable to meet in person monthly at a local Legion Hall, we worked away at home, and no one, to my knowledge, ran out of fabric! Either making a top or a finished quilt, they brought them to my home and they were stored there until distribution was possible,

I am glad to say that in the past few months we have been able to supply 92 quilts to military bases in Ontario, Quebec and Newfoundland/Labrador. Presentations to retired individuals at home or in retirement homes have not been possible although some have been presented in outdoor settings. At present our group is in need of a Presenter to attend any of these presentations. They do not need to be a quilter but are comfortable speaking to groups.


